


Item 6 – Power Portfolio Update: Long-term Power Contracts






Item 6 – Power Portfolio Update: Overview






Item 6 – Power Portfolio Update: LMP's (July 1-20)






Note: "LMP" = Locational Marginal Price





Item 6 – Power Portfolio Update: Takeaways

- VCE has successfully navigated compliance period 4 & meeting future compliance period targets should not be an issue
- Generally, VCE's PPAs are performing as expected
 - Putah & Willy 9 Chap 2 BESS are experiencing some hiccups with the charge/discharge cycles. Technical issues are being addressed.
 - Indian Valley small hydro PPA may be extended
- VCE's utility-scale procurement for the foreseeable future consists of stand-alone BESS, wind and baseload (most likely geothermal).
 - VCE's membership in CC Power is critical to contracting some of these resource types
 - CC Power is currently evaluating geothermal responses from a recent RFI
- The Long duration storage (LDS) project (Goal Line) that was terminated should not be an issue for VCE to backfill

Item 7 –Strategic Plan Update (2026-29): Administrative Updates

Administrative Updates

After the preliminary review, Staff and the Strategic Plan Task Group generally agreed VCE's strategic plan is robust and comprehensive, addressing key priorities and providing a solid base from which to move forward. The following administrative updates have been included in the staff report preliminary daft attachments.

- Near-Term Vision (Launch) Transition to completed during launch.
- "Affordability" Added throughout the document to emphasize and elevate existing customer rate priority.
 - For example, **VCE MISSION** Deliver cost-competitive <u>affordable</u> clean electricity, product choice, price stability, energy efficiency, and greenhouse gas emission reductions.
- Startup to Operational In general VCE has completed key organizational startup components and transitioned to operational effectiveness and efficiency.
 - Transitioned language related to startup phase in specific sections.
 - Language transitioned from "establish" or "obtain" to "sustain" or "maintain".

Item 7 –Strategic Plan Update (2026-29): Initial Draft Updates

Affordability – An emphasis has been generally incorporated in the Goals and Objectives of the attached draft Update.

• e.g. Objective 1.4: Manage customer rates to optimize VCE's financial goals while maintaining rate affordability and competitiveness with PG&E.

Local distributed energy resources (DER) into VCE's resource mix

• e.g. Objective 2.3 Identify and pursue cost-effective, local distributed energy resources, including both front-of-meter solar+storage resources for VCE's renewable energy supply portfolio, as well as behind-the-meter solar+storage aggregations (VPPs) to help reduce RA requirements.

Re-emphasize commitment and focus on low-income and other vulnerable customers.

• e.g Objective 3.5: Develop and implement customer programs and initiatives that prioritize decarbonization, community resiliency, rate affordability, and customer savings, including focused efforts on low-income and medically vulnerable customers.





Strategic Plan Feedback

Survey Results

- 5.16.25: 45,117 Contacts received email
 - Survey + Invite to Workshop #1
 - Open rate 13% (low/avg)
- Participants ranked their top priorities:
 - #1 (46%): 100% clean or renewable electricity
 - > #2: (41%): Giving discounts to customers
 - > #3: (39%): Customer-benefiting programs
 - > #4: (38%): Building financial reserves





Strategic Plan Feedback

Survey Results: Qualitative Feedback

- Feedback was varied, some recurrent themes:
 - Affordability/High Rates
 - Education/VCE Marketing (more brand recognition needed)
 - Desire for VCE Municipalization

"Cheaper electricity, right now there's not much real savings over just using PGE. Bills are too high to really think about other priorities."

"Customer service is a plus one being able to talk to someone for help."

"Customer education about electricity and gas prices even though gas is not your game."

Survey: Next Steps

- Subsequent survey in development
 - Will be sent to 200+ participants that provided emails for follow-up
 - Feedback from second survey will be incorporated into Strategic Plan draft reviewed at September Board Strategic Plan Workshop
 - Focus Groups planned for 2026; input from surveys will be incorporated into design
