The BioMAT program was created by SB 1122 (2012, Rubio) to support procurement from small-scale bioenergy projects, including wastewater treatment, agricultural bioenergy, and generation from byproducts of sustainable forest management. The program was only made available to investor-owned utilities because at the time, there was only one CCA serving customers. In the decade since, 23 new CCAs have launched and now serve more than 11 million customers across California.

Yolo County enjoys a vibrant agricultural economy and heritage that produces a number of commodities for California and beyond. Accordingly, Yolo County has an abundance of organic waste from agriculture that contribute to short-lived climate pollutants and could be repurposed or diverted to better uses. Allowing VCE access to the BioMAT program can help VCE potentially take advantage of this organic waste stream to create local bioenergy projects that provide renewable baseload power.

For these reasons, VCE is pleased to support AB 843 and we thank Assemblymember Aguiar-Curry for her leadership in bringing this measure forward. We respectfully request your “Aye” vote.
