Section 2.4.2 of the JPA agreement allows additional jurisdictions to join VCEA.

Any city or county, that is not an initial member, may request to become a member of VCEA by submitting (1) a resolution adopted by its City Council or Board of Supervisors to the Board of VCEA. The Board shall review the request and shall vote to approve or disapprove the request. (2)The Board may establish conditions, including but not limited to financial conditions, under which the city or county may become a member of VCEA. (3)The Board shall notify the then members of VCEA of this request and the date that the request will be on the Board's meeting agenda for action. The date set for Board action shall be at least forty-five (45) days from the date the notice is mailed to the members. If the request is approved by the Board, the city or county shall become a member of VCEA under the terms and conditions set forth by the Board and upon approval and execution of this Agreement by the city or county.

(2) Recommended Conditions of Membership

- Adopt a resolution to execute the JPA Agreement of VCEA;
- City of Woodland adopt a CCE Ordinance;
- City of Woodland make a financial contribution equal to that of Yolo County and the City of Davis in the amount of \$500,000 to cover its share of Agency and program implementation costs.
- City of Woodland is requested to designate a staff lead on CCE and continue its public outreach efforts
- Appoint two City Council members to serve on the VCEA Board of Directors;
- Appoint three community members to serve on the VCEA Advisory Committee.





(3) Approval process

- City of Davis and Yolo County consider membership request (May 16th)
- Waive 45 day review period
- VCEA Board action in June Allowing Woodland to participate in Implementation Plan development
